#### 9. AUTUMN SHOW & MARKET DAY - 4 MAY 2024

This year with two Judges for our Autumn and Spring Shows as well as increasing what our club pays judges/guest speakers for travel costs together with prize money, hall rental, insurance etc. – we have added costs to cover, and these two events (Autumn & Spring Shows) are our main fund raisers for the year. I have started organising our raffle. Thus far I have had a positive response from Rocky Point, Eden Seeds, and the PA Hotel have once again given us a generous gift voucher, and Searles generously, have also come on board with products for the raffle for our market day. Bronwyn from Earthfood has also given us a bottle of her Product for our Market Day Raffle. We will be using the sticker method on the pots again and our usual show schedule. ## **Guest Speaker**

<u>Bronwyn Holm</u> founder of Earthfood was our speaker. Bronwyn explained how her product could be used to increase/improve harvest yields, plant/tree health and lushness, and save on costs and labour, not to mention water saving. "Earthfood" Bronwyn describes as rainforest in a bottle powered by live microbes. Historically handed down in Bronwyn's family since the mid-1880s and used in the Hermitage



Estate Wineries in Australia, (Dalwood Estate now as one of them) when Eggert Holm her great great grandfather, was their master winemaker using live microbes. With a soil scientist the IP for suspending the microbes (to put them asleep) was created so the product can now be sent globally, and the microbes survive and thrive whether used in a pot-plant or on acres of farming land for food. Bronwyn showed how simply her product can be added to a spray bottle, used with water, as a foliar feed. Bronwyn says her product could potentially improve the health and lushness of plants and crops. Bronwyn told us that potentially results could be seen in 4

weeks, and she recommends a fortnightly foliar spray with her microbial concentrate She also brought along product to sell and came armed with an informative video to show us about her product. Earthfood also produce a 100 % certified organic weed terminator being 100% pine oil which is a natural suffocant. The product does not remain residue in the ground and is harmless to worms, bacteria, frogs and other pollinators. She has kindly donated a bottle valued at \$25.00 to be used as one of our next month's raffle prizes. Bronwyn's online shop is located at Slacks Creek and a quick google search will bring up the website.
