# Judge's Comments

David Stephensen our Judge – had no negative comments at all – he said everything was well done and we presented lovely show benches'

It was so hot!!!!! at our meeting last Saturday<sup>1</sup> – thanks to everyone who braved the heat – not too many cups of tea or coffee were being made, but loads of water consumed.



Brett Malcolm (aka Frog Man) spoke on Frogs of Ipswich. (I have to confess to not being able to hear too much of Brett's talk due to fans going and at times I think the microphone was either too close or too far away from Brett's mouth. However, a short synopsis follows.

You could go online at <a href="https://www.frogid.net.au">https://www.frogid.net.au</a> if you wanted to join the movement to help increase and protect the number of frogs in the environment. Brett covered three main topics, how do we identify them, how we can help, and Ipswich's frog diversity. Unfortunately, he didn't bring any frogs along and I think members were looking forward to this part of the talk. As it turns out if clubs wanted frogs as part of the presentation Brett needs to apply for permits etc. to be able to move them. Frogs have smooth, somewhat slimy skin. Toads have dry, warty skin. Frogs have long legs, built for jumping. Toads

have shorter legs and prefer to get around by crawling. Frogs usually have big, bulging eyes, while toads' eyes are more subtle in appearance. Frogs only eat food that moves, toads will eat anything – dead or alive – cat food – anything. Brett tells us that toads are actually far more intelligent than frogs!!

We then welcomed Coral and Kevin Larsen from Larsen's Nursery at Fernvale. (Two Guest speakers! Bonus) Kevin and Coral are well known in the Nursery Industry and most of us know them to be at all the major plant shows and events. Coral spoke in particular about Caladiums and told us how much these plants love "chooky poo". Kevin's secret to mixing his potting medium is his trusty old cement mixer. He uses premium potting mix from



Sapar, adds a bucket of water to his old cement mixer, with some coir peat and some perlite and gives her a good whirl. He says he has been using this method for years. Coral repots all her caladiums every year without fail, and in the colder months when they start to go to sleep, all the pots are placed on their sides, so the rain doesn't get in the rot the bulbs. When the night temperatures are over 16 degrees these plants start to wake up for summer. The Larsens brought plants along to sell and we were all eager to snap up the plants we wanted to take home. Their nursery is at Fernvale, but Coral says to telephone before you drive out there to ensure they are home, as they have appointments sometimes. Ken had a cracked rib on the day, so it was big effort for him to carry the trays in and out for us. Thank you to the Larsens!

Thank you so much to all who stayed behind to help with the clean up at the end of the meeting. Makes so much different when everyone chips in, and also the day was so hot! meant we could all finish up a little faster. THANK YOU.
