In the 1930s, the City of Ipswich chose, as its floral emblem, the **Turleys Special Bougainvillea**, and many were planted around Ipswich. It became the emblem of the Ipswich Horticultural Society Inc and is used on all signage.



In the 1990s, the Council replaced the Bougainvillea with a native plant, **Eucalyptus Curtsii** a small and rare Eucalyptus occurring naturally at Dinmore, Collingwood Park, and the White Rock area.
