### Conditions for Monthly Shows

- 1 All flowers and vegetables except for floral art must be grown by the exhibitor
- 2 Pot plants must be property of the exhibitor for 3 months before showing on the bench
- 3 All exhibits (flowers and pot plants) to be named when name is known
- 4 Exhibitor may make more than one entry in each class
- 5 Cut flowers to be staged in bottles – colour and size recommended by the Society – floral work in containers as detailed in the schedule and provided by the exhibitor
- 6 Pot plants must not be shown in a pot over 25 cm in diameter
- 7 No bests will be awarded if less than 3 entries
- 8 The Judge has the power to award 2<sup>nd</sup> prize if in their opinion the exhibits are not worthy of first prize
- 9 Any protest arising out of entries will be reviewed by the committee, but the Judges’ decision is final
- 10 Monthly shows are open to members only, where total points or most bests compete for the various trophies listed below.
