<u>Guest Speaker to our June Meeting</u> – Carol Kerkin⁵ (and husband John). As per usual Carol gave an amazing talk on "Cottage Gardens". What is a cottage garden? It's a way of gardening, it's a way of life. A cottage garden is an informal, romantic style of garden characterised by its dense, overflowing planting of a mix of flowers, vegetables, herbs, and climbing plants, often with an emphasis on natural materials and a sense of abundance. It prioritizes a relaxed, whimsical atmosphere over formal design principles, with winding paths, and a mix of colours and textures. Carol gave us lots of examples from different interest groups of plants that can go into our gardens and also brought along plants to sell. One member queried growing bulbs in south east Queensland and yes, we can grow bulbs in our region. In the example of Jonquils Carol recommends when the flower dies down, although unsightly let the brown stalk die down naturally as this "feeds" the bulb for the following season. They can be left in the ground to pop up next season but leave a little sign so you know where they are and don't accidently *DIG THEM UP*. Carol passed around some lovely examples and some gorgeous roses from her own garden. Thank you Carol and John.
